

## **Our Night Sky for November 25th, 2024**

**Tonight, and for the rest of this week you will have a good opportunity to see all the outer planets in the same session. I am suggesting after nine p.m. so Mars is included. Each evening this week Mars will be just above the northeastern horizon and rising so by ten or eleven Mars will be a bit more accessible above the horizon. The rest of the outer planets though are spread across the sky. Jupiter is well above due east about three or four hand widths above the eastern horizon and Saturn is much closer to setting so don't wait too long to center your binoculars the one of the prettiest sights in our sky a couple of hand widths above southwest.**

**Now let's try something much trickier, Uranus is well placed and if your binoculars are on a tripod you should be able to spot it. Go back to easy to find Jupiter, just to the right of Jupiter there are several stars in a triangle, this is part of the constellation Taurus. Now picture two legs extending to the right about four times the size of the triangle, Uranus is about mid way between the two stars at the end of these legs. Binoculars should reveal a brighter object not twinkling. Congratulations you have located Uranus.**

**This week Neptune is a bit trickier but now that you have spotted Uranus this might be easy. Trickier because all I can suggest locating it, is that it is about three hand widths above due south. Good luck enjoying Our Night Sky.**
